1. American Tobacco Company (Now site of Commonwealth)

As you enter the City from the north, the Lucky Strike smokestack is an

iconic part of the Reidsville landscape iust like the former company that put the City on the map!



2. Reidsville City Hall

Once the Reidsville Post Office, the present-day City Hall includes

a Gordon Samstag mural that pays tribute to the City's past.



3. Reidsville Municipal Building

Now home to the Reidsville Police Department, the Municipal Building was created to house all of City Government back



4. Reidsville Public Library

in 1926.

The Reidsville Library was actually the brainchild of the local Woman's

Christian Temperance Union. Now it is part of the Rockingham County Library System.



5. 'Budding Future' Sculpture

This sculpture by Greensboro artist Jim Gallucci looks toward the future while paying homage to the City's past. The side panels of the sculpture show historical places and people from the City's yesteryear.

6. Kelly's Way

7. Mural Park

This scenic spot in the downtown is highlighted by a mural depicting

8. Market Square

Farmers Market and a favorite place for concerts, outdoor movies and more!



9. "Meet Me at the Square"
